Library System and Interagency Cooperation

The library is participating in the statewide Speak Up for Libraries campaign. Starting June 2, there will be postcards at the reference desk and addresses for federal representatives. Patrons can fill out the postcard with testimony on why libraries are important to them and drop-off at the reference desk. At the end of July, we'll send them to SCLS to get bundled with other postcards from around the state to be sent to appropriate legislators. 20 filled out postcards were sent back to SCLS on June 19.
