These free resources are either designated by their author to be there, or the copyright has expired on the materials. If you can't find something in these websites it's likely because the copyright is still current, so your next best bet is to check the library catalog.

Largest Free Book Resources

[Google Books](#)

Has over 15 million books listed. However, not all books have full text available. If the book is not available it will list where it can be bought and/or borrowed.

[HathiTrust](#)

A partnership between academic and research institutions allowing access to millions of books online. It manages items following U.S. Copyright Law, and has a lot of digitized materials available from academic libraries.

[Internet Archive](#)

Has available over 475 billion webpages, but also 28 million books and texts. The Internet Archive is a non-profit that focuses on providing access to information in a digital format.

An online library of free eBooks. Has over 60,000 free eBooks available for use.

Has over 165,000 full-text books, with 140,000 of them being free to users. There is books available on reference materials, literature and languages, history, social sciences, medicine and health, and much more.

Has a wide collection of materials from across the globe. Set up as a partnership between the U.S. Library of Congress and UNESCO, with contributions from other organizations throughout the world.
